

Philippines Export Demurrage & Detention Calculation Revision

Dear Valued Customer

Effective from **Price Calculation Date February 15, 2021**, we hereby notify you the following change at our Export Demurrage and Detention tariff calculation in Philippines.

Maersk will use a Progressive method to calculate export demurrage and detention charges upon expiry of the freetime.

The tariff itself and the agreed free time will not be affected by this change.

To explain the new method:

Progressive means: For customers with special deals, after the extended free time expires, any additional days will be subject to the demurrage and detention charges as per the relevant day count in our tariff tier structure. This means that the subsequent demurrage and detention charges beyond extended free time will not automatically be calculated basing on the tariffs of 1st tier.

Please refer to the below table which shows the change using a hypothetical example of a customer with a special detention free time agreement for Dry 40' in Philippines:

A customer that has 7 days of detention freetime in place, returns the container on day 21.
